

**State of Nevada Certified Court Reporters Board
Legislative Regulations Committee Meeting – September 9, 2025
Agenda Item #8**

For possible action; review and discussion to formulate a regulation that will require court reporters to state on the record, their CCR and firm identification number and other applicable information on all Nevada venued cases.

RECOMMENDATION:

Make it mandatory for Nevada court reporters to state on the record before reporting any proceeding in a Nevada-venued case; their name, NV CCR number, the name of the firm who hired them, and the firm's registered firm number. This will ensure all parties they have a certified court reporter and a licensed court reporting firm reporting and producing a transcript of the proceeding. As of January 1, 2025, California made this mandatory. It would help raise awareness to attorneys of the requirement to use licensed firms and certified reporters and drive home the requirement in court reporters that they must be working for a licensed Nevada firm when reporting Nevada venued cases.

STATEMENT BY THE COURT REPORTER AT THE BEGINNING OF AN IN-PERSON DEPOSITION:
