Grant Overview

Grant: Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Post-Fire (HMGP-Post Fire) FM-5546-NV

HMGP - Post Fire Lock-in Amount: \$1,285,231.00

Summary: The Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Post-Fire, or HMGP Post-Fire, provides federal funding to support mitigation activities following a Fire Management Assistance Grant declaration. Unlike traditional HMGP, which follows a major disaster declaration, HMGP Post-Fire allows funding to be made available more quickly after a significant wildfire. The purpose is to reduce future risk to people, property, and infrastructure—particularly from post-fire hazards such as flooding, erosion, and debris flows. Eligible projects can include watershed stabilization, infrastructure protection, defensible space projects, and other long-term risk reduction measures.



Project Ranking

Prior to any Nevada Hazard Mitigation Working Group meetings, The Working Group will begin by reviewing the project summary sheet and the full application to understand the project scope, requested funds, total cost, match, and any management costs.

During the meeting, each applicant will provide a short overview and answer any questions. Members will then independently rank each project for recommended funding priority in relation to the other projects.

After ranking is compiled, the group will review the overall ranking, discuss as needed, and vote to provide a recommendation on funding priority. The final ranked list will then be forwarded to the Chief of the Office of Emergency Management for final approval prior to submission to FEMA.
