## Nevada Office of Emergency Management/Homeland Security

**Brett Compston, Administrator (Voting member)**



Colonel (Ret.) Brett Compston is the Administrator of the Office of Emergency Management / Homeland Security and Homeland Security Advisor for the State of Nevada, appointed in November 2024. He retired from the Nevada Army National Guard after 25 years of service. Most recently Compston served as Director of Operations, Training, and Plans, overseeing statewide training, operations, mobilizations, modernization, and strategic planning.

Compston spent 15 years specializing in National Guard domestic operations,

responsible for and leading specialty capabilities and subordinate units and task forces related to weapons of mass destruction response (WMD), Counter-Drug operations, civil disturbance operations, a joint operations center (JOC), provost marshal, anti-terrorism, emergency management, force protection, and integration and synergy with fusion centers in NV. His team also led the NVNG disaster response line of effort with international partner nations Fiji and Tonga. During the pandemic, Compston was named Nevada's Incident Commander for the COVID-19 pandemic response. He has deployed to Iraq, Afghanistan, and Bosnia, along with overseas service in Germany. Compston served on multiple state and national emergency management committees and is active in IAEM, NEPA, and NEMA. Compston earned two Master's degrees, a Harvard Kennedy School Executive Certificate and is a Harvard Senior Executive Fellow Program graduate, FEMA Vanguard Executive Crisis Leaders Fellow, graduate of the Naval Postgraduate School Executive Leaders Program, and a Certified Emergency Manager (CEM).

Former WSPA President & CEO



Catherine Reheis-Boyd is a nationally respected energy and environmental policy leader with more than four decades of experience in the oil and natural gas industry. She recently concluded a 35-year career with the Western States Petroleum Association (WSPA), where she served as President and CEO, leading advocacy and operations across five Western states.

During her tenure, Reheis-Boyd guided WSPA through significant regulatory and market change, working on transportation fuels, air and water quality, climate policy, and energy innovation, while building strong relationships with policymakers, regulators, and diverse stakeholders. # Nevada Legislative Member

## Senator Robin Titus (Voting member)



Robin L. Titus, M.D., is the Minority Leader of the Nevada Senate, representing Senate District 17. A physician and lifelong Nevadan, she previously served four terms in the Nevada Assembly, including as Assembly Minority Leader from 2019 to 2022. Titus earned both her bachelor's degree and medical degree from the University of Nevada, Reno, and has practiced medicine in Lyon County for decades, providing care to rural communities across Smith Valley and Wellington. Elected to the Nevada Senate in 2022, she was chosen by her colleagues to lead the Senate Republican Caucus in 2024. In addition to her legislative service, Titus is active in local civic life, including as president of the Smith Valley Historical Society.

Rochelle Nguyen is an attorney serving in the Nevada Senate since 2022, following her appointment in December of that year, after previously serving in the Nevada Assembly from 2019 to 2022 (appointed December 2018), participating in three regular and three special legislative sessions. She currently serves on the Senate Jobs and Economy Committee and has held key leadership roles, including Chair of Health and Human Services and Vice Chair of Judiciary during the 2021 Session, as well as serving on the Education Committee. In the 2019 Session, she served on the Growth and Infrastructure,

Health and Human Services, and Judiciary Committees. During the 2019–2020 interim, she chaired the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice, served as Vice Chair of the Interim Study on Pretrial Release of Defendants in Criminal Cases, and was a member of the Nevada Sentencing Commission. Nguyen holds a BA in Sociology from the University of Puget Sound (1999) and a JD from UNLV’s Boyd School of Law (2002). She was born in 1977 in Vancouver, Washington, married to Matt Lay, and has two children, Henry and Hannah.

Bert Gurr is a Republican member of the Nevada State Assembly representing Assembly District 33, a largely rural region encompassing parts of Elko, Eureka, Lincoln, Nye, and White Pine counties.
