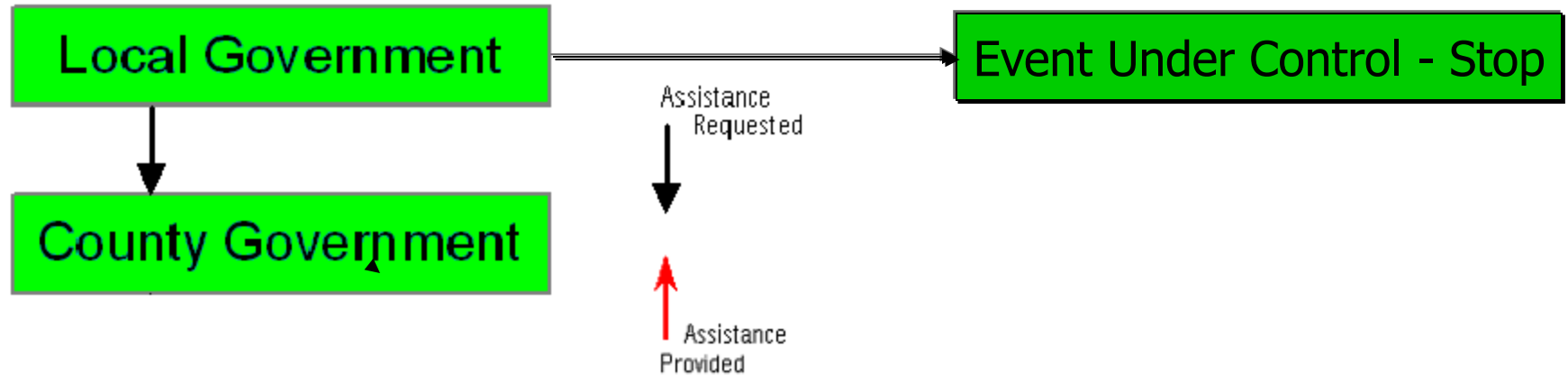


The Emergency or Disaster Declaration Process



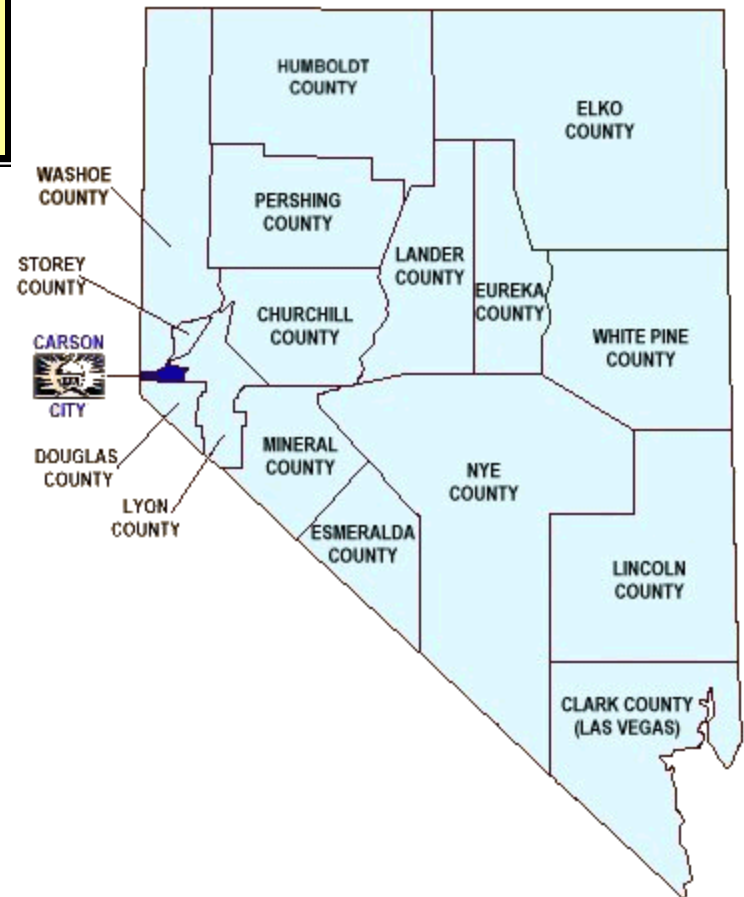
Local Declaration Process



A declaration/resolution is required for inclusion in a Presidential Declaration. When in doubt declare for an emergency/disaster. (Local to County)

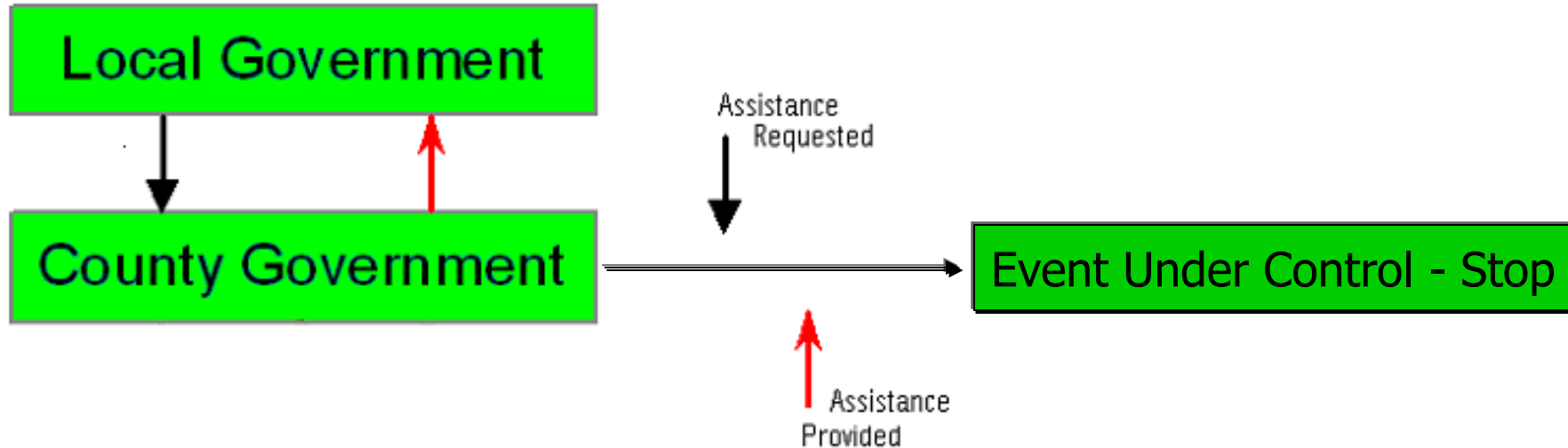
County Government

- Assists local governments
 - Tribe, or cities and county residents
 - Supplemental Funding
 - Equipment
 - Expertise
 - Other resources
 - Nevada Emergency Management Assistance Compact



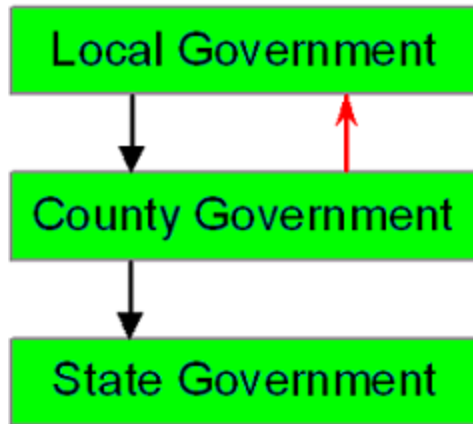
County Government Role

(assists local government)



Then,
if situation dictates,
request assistance from
the state. A declaration
from the county is required.

The Declaration Process in a County Declared Disaster



County provides support to local government

County requests assistance from the State *when* needs exceed all available local and county resources

Local government continues to coordinate and direct all efforts

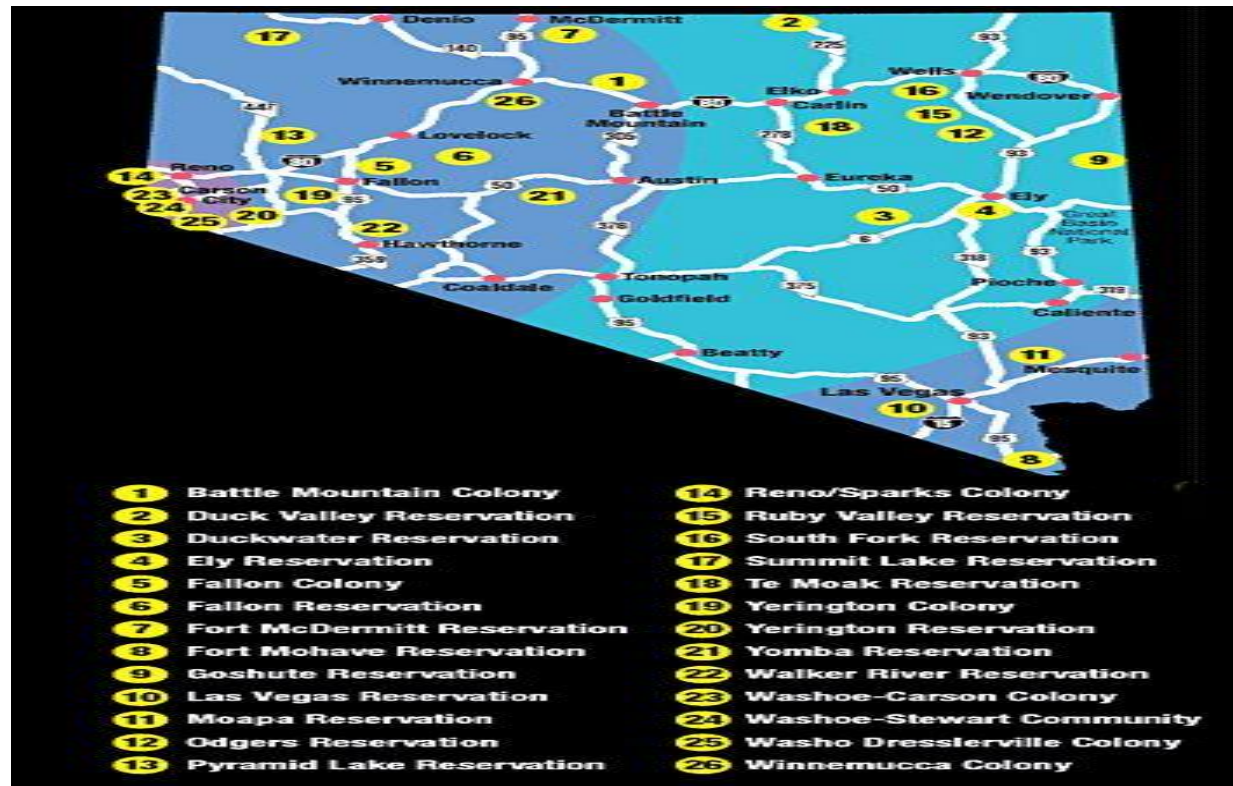
Tribal Declaration

- ❑ Tribal nations located within Nevada, are recognized as sovereign nations.



Tribal Declaration

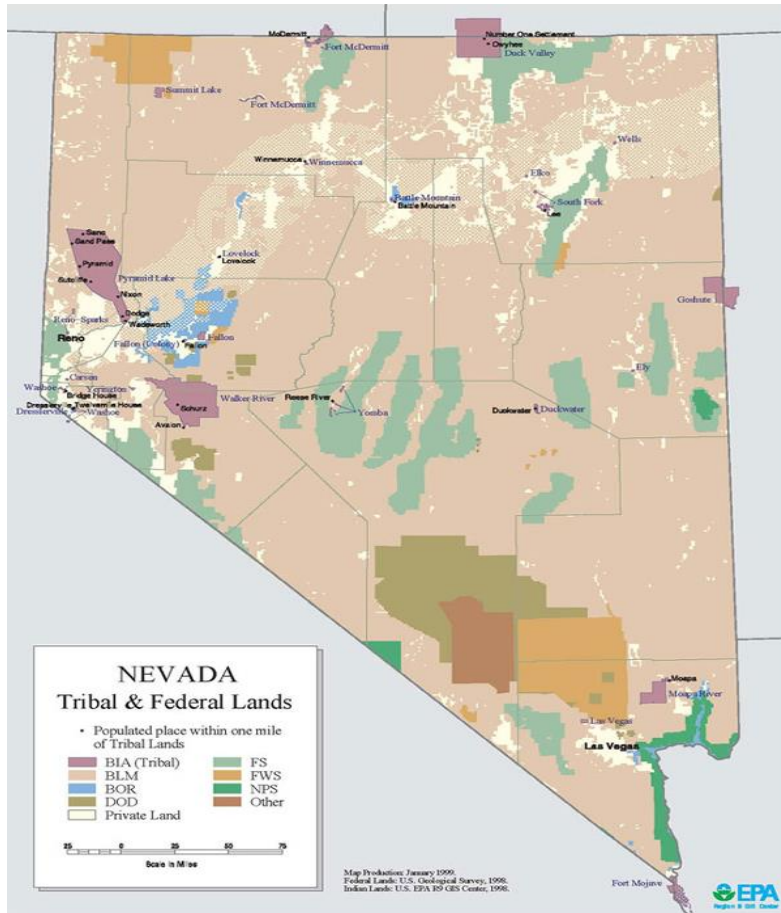
Tribal nations can apply through the county, state, or directly to FEMA.



Tribal Declaration

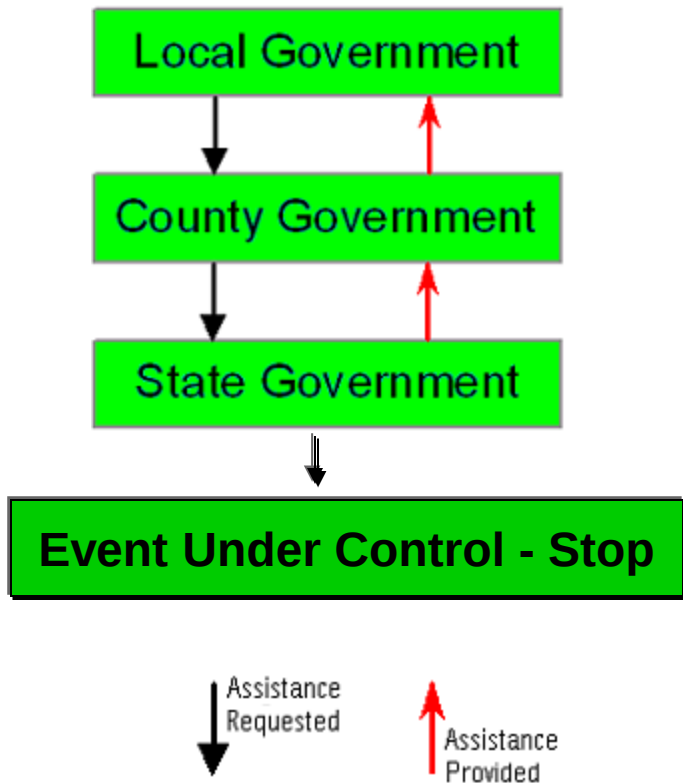
County/state/federal involvement for resolution of the situation requires that the tribal nation request assistance using the same procedures as any other incorporated community within a county

State Government



- ☐ Assists county government
- ☐ Provides state resources
 - From state cache
 - From contractors
 - National Guard
 - NEMAC
- ☐ Requests Presidential Declaration (when necessary)
- ☐ Coordinates with FEMA

Federal Government

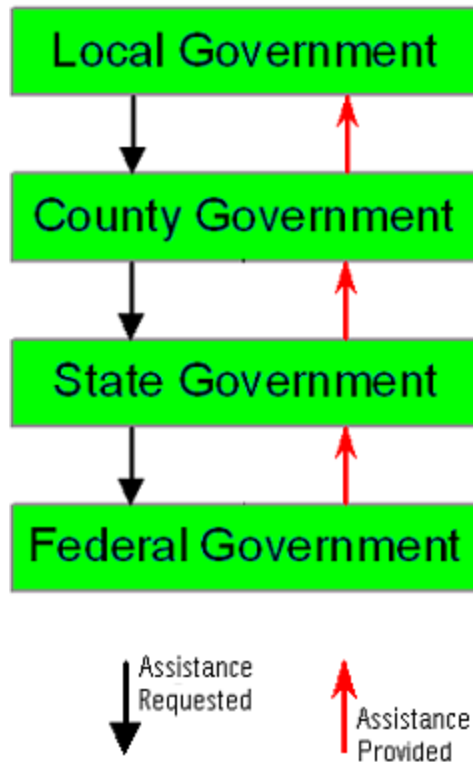
- ❑ FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) acts on behalf of the President to provide:
 - ❑ Grants
 - ❑ Other resources from Departments
 - ❑ Federal Agencies support
 - ❑ Military support (Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force)
 - ❑ WMD response teams
 - ❑ Etc.

The Declaration Process



Federal Government provides
assistance

Coordinated through the state,
Coordinated through the county,
to local government

Declaration Pros and Cons

- ❑ FEMA and affiliated agencies will monitor the event through an on-site liaison or through DEM's point of contact
 - ❑ Other federal agencies may provide assistance without a Presidential declaration
 - Without a Presidential declaration, FEMA funding is not available
 - Even with a Presidential declaration, not all programs requested in the declaration may be approved
 - Local government or tribal nation is responsible for all costs of the event
