

The U.S. Department of Energy Transportation Emergency Preparedness Program (TEPP), in cooperation with state, federal and local agencies including the U.S. Department of Energy's Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP), Nevada State Police (NHP), Nevada Civil Support Team (CST), Nevada Division of Emergency Management, Nevada Office of Nuclear Projects, and the Nevada Radiation Control Program will be conducting a Transportation Training and Exercise event—the Nevada ROAD-TREX.

This ROAD-TREX will provide responders along and near the I-80 corridor the opportunity to exercise their capabilities in response to a transportation accident involving radiological materials. The exercise will involve the use of live radiation sources and will start at 8 a.m. and finish at 4 p.m. on the dates and locations listed:

Wednesday, September 4, 2024 - Elko, NV Thursday, September 5, 2024 - Winnemucca, NV Saturday, September 7, 2024 - Fernley, NV

The morning session will provide a Modular Emergency Response Radiological Transportation Training (MERRTT) refresher training, followed by a break for lunch. The afternoon session will feature a series of stations set up for First Responders to exercise critical skills essential to a safe and successful response to a radiological transportation incident. The stations will allow for multiple evolutions of each phase of the response, thereby allowing multiple agencies/teams a chance to exercise their response skills. Concurrent with the responder drills, agency leadership will convene for a discussion-based tabletop exercise to reinforce the knowledge and actions required for their roles during a radiological transportation incident.

The exercise is access-restricted, and space is limited, so if your agency would like to participate in the event, use the QR codes to register or visit https://www.nvntqs.net. A FEMA Student ID number (SID) is required to register for and participate in this event.
