

1 **SUMMARY: A RESOLUTION OF HUMBOLDT COUNTY**
2 **DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN HUMBOLDT COUNTY**
3 **DUE TO FLOODING INVOLVING PARADISE VALLEY, THE**
4 **HUMBOLDT RIVER, LITTLE HUMBOLDT RIVER AND OTHER AREAS**
5 **OF HUMBOLDT COUNTY, AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY**
6 **RELATING THERETO.**

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12 **WHEREAS,** Humboldt County has suffered damage to roads,
13 streets, bridges, culverts, storm drains, homes, businesses and other
14 public facilities caused by flooding; and
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16 **WHEREAS,** Humboldt County also anticipates that additional
17 damage to roads, streets, culverts, storm drains, homes, businesses and
18 other public facilities may be caused by continued flooding as currently
19 forecasted for the days to come; and
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21 **WHEREAS,** the impact of these damages and anticipated
22 damages threatens health, well-being, and public safety of the citizens
23 of Humboldt County; and
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25 **WHEREAS,** the cost of response, clean-up, repair and
26 replacement of such damaged property is or may be far in excess of
27 available Humboldt County resources; and
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29 **WHEREAS,** the declaration of an emergency allows Humboldt
30 County and the Emergency Management to speed up the delivery
31 of resources required to more effectively respond to an emergency and
32 meet the needs of the community during a time of crisis;
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34 **WHEREAS,** NRS 241.020 allows the Board of County
35 Commissioners to call a public meeting without providing proper notice
36 under the Open Meeting Laws, NRS Chapter 241, in an emergency and
37 said emergency exists due to unforeseen circumstances which require
38 immediate action due to disasters causes by flood and any impairment
39 to the health and safety of the public; and
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42 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY**
43 **COMMISSIONERS OF HUMBOLDT COUNTY, NEVADA THAT:**
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46 1. The Board of County Commissioners of Humboldt County declares
47 an emergency under the provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes,
48 Chapter 414, and activates its Emergency Operations Plan, its
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1 procedures, attachments and appendices to monitor the situation,
2 develop a detailed damage assessment, alleviate hardship and initiate
3 appropriate relief actions and mitigation measures by departments and
4 agencies of local government.
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7 2. Severability: If any provision of this resolution or amendments thereto,
8 or the application thereof to any person, thing or circumstance is held to
9 be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or provisions or
10 applications of the Resolution or amendments thereto which can be
11 given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end
12 the provisions of this resolution and amendments thereto are declared
13 to be severable.
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16 3. Constitutionality: If any section, clause or phrase of the Resolution
17 shall be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
18 the remaining provisions of this Resolution shall continue in full force and
19 effect.
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22 4. Effective Date: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from
23 and after passage, approval and publication as required by law.
